Multiple community members were present both in person and via Zoom.

## **Approval of Minutes**

- July meeting minutes approved unanimously.
- September meeting date moved from Sept. 24 to Sept. 22 (due to Rosh Hashanah); approved unanimously.

#### **Public Comment**

## **Residential Burglaries**

• Evelyn, McCullen Association President (Hal, Orchard, Burling): Reported a string of daytime burglaries believed to be linked to the same crew. Requested stronger communication and urgent police intervention.

• <u>Wayne Meyer, Retired Judge/Prosecutor:</u> Highlighted the impact of property crime on vulnerable populations, emphasized the importance of reporting all incidents, and shared burglary prevention tips.

## **Chronic Drug-Related Issues**

• Linda Siebert Rapaport, East Division block representative: Raised concerns about ongoing drug activity at Division & Clark, and near Taco Bell. Requested more visible police presence, updates on patrol plans, and public information on long-term strategies.

## **Council Member Updates**

#### **Bob Johnson**

- Reported on nominating committee activities related to 2026 commission vacancies.
- Discussed the CARE mental health initiative and the proposed "Rapid Alternate Response Program" to shift non-emergency complaints away from CPD.

#### Karen Kane

- Attended CCPSA City Commission meeting; voiced 18th District opposition to new restrictions on traffic stops (based on survey of 1,300+ residents, 66% opposed).
- Shared details of a new citywide survey (QR codes available) and encouraged strong local participation.
- announced the next CCPSA citywide meeting at DePaul College Prep on August 29.

#### **Brad Kessler**

- Reported on collaborative efforts to combat repeat retail theft along Division Street and Michigan Avenue.
- Shared findings from FOIA requests on Michigan Avenue protests: only three events were properly permitted out of hundreds since 2022. Advocacy for transparency and enforcement will continue.

# Presentation: Detective Mike Shields – Burglary Trends & CPD Detective Process

#### **Background**

• I am a 25-year CPD veteran, currently an Area 3 detective.

#### **Recent Burglary Patterns**

- Confirmed presence of a sophisticated burglary crew targeting affluent residential areas.
- Crew tactics include disguises, stolen license plates, fast entry/exit, and frequent vehicle changes.
- Noted seasonal patterns (crew winters in Miami).

## **Case & Prosecution Challenges**

- Several members charged: investigations ongoing.
- Effective prosecution requires video evidence with clear facial images. Community video sharing is essential.
- Noted improvements in communication and charging consistency under the new State's Attorney administration.

#### **Prevention Recommendations**

- Install video surveillance (even low-cost systems like Ring).
- Always lock doors—including in high-rises.
- Be cautious of opportunistic thieves linked to delivery personnel.

#### **Resource Constraints**

• Detective staffing remains limited, with each property crimes detective handling multiple new cases daily.

### **Community Engagement**

• Detective Shields remained after the meeting for private, case-specific questions.

## Presentation: Commander Chris Biefeldt – District Strategies & Updates

#### **Background**

• Recently returned to lead the 18th District; praised the community's engagement and support.

#### **Crime Trends**

- **Burglaries:** Primarily daytime; emphasized prevention and target-hardening.
- **Robberies:** Concentrated in River North/bar district, often linked to intoxicated victims.
- **Drug/Nuisance Corridors:** Longstanding issues at Division & Clark addressed through dispersals, arrests, and requests for long-term investigations.

#### Air and Water Show (August 2025)

- Successful, no arrests or citations.
- Main challenge: severe traffic congestion after the event.
- Staffing: 200+ officers, mostly from outside the district, including specialized units.

## Recognition

• Training facility at Chicago Ave. & Costner named for the late Commander Bauer.

#### **District Council Resources & Feedback**

- Residents encouraged them to complete the citywide survey on CPD traffic stop restrictions.
- The public is invited to attend or join via Zoom for the August 29 CCPSA Citywide Commission meeting.
- Urged reporting of all property crimes, regardless of scale.
- Security reminders: install exterior cameras, keep doors locked, and share surveillance videos when possible.
- Council members and CPD personnel are available after the meeting for informal Q&A.

## **Community Concerns**

- Retail Theft: Ongoing multi-agency collaboration; updates to follow.
- **FOIA/Permitting:** Continued push for transparency regarding large unpermitted gatherings on Michigan Avenue.
- Staffing: Council advocating for stronger detective resources for property crimes.
- **Future Meetings:** September meeting confirmed for Sept. 22, 2025. Nominating committee activities are ongoing.

- CCPSA Citywide Commission Meeting: August 29, 2025, at DePaul College Prep (inperson and Zoom access).
