### Public Comment - Rules & Follow Up

#### **Rules of Engagement**

- 2 min/speaker = ~10 speakers (typically 20 minutes total)
- Request to make public comment must be submitted within 30-minutes of start of meeting
- Order of speakers randomly selected
- No disruption of speakers
- No harassment or disrespect will be tolerated (zero tolerance policy)

#### **Follow Up**

- District Councilors and staff will take official minutes of public comments made
- District Councilors may address comments in real time or may follow up with community member at a later time


## CPD District Strategic Plan Process

## What are District Strategic Plans (DSPs)?

Annual plans outlining a District's core crime reduction priorities and community engagement goals over the course of a year.

The plans are intended to be developed in close collaboration with community.

Established by a CPD policy and governed by the reforms under the consent decree.



### Purpose of DSPs

The DSP process launched in 2021 as a way for community to participate in developing annual district priorities.


Meaningfully including community in the process builds:

- Public safety
- Community trust
- Accountability



DSPs should also help inform resource allocation.

- Assessment Plan: How process and impact will be measured

### Plans to Improve the DSP Process

The Commission established a goal for the Superintendent of CPD to overhaul the DSP process. The goal requires gathering meaningful DC input.

DCs across the city are engaging communities and collecting ideas.

DCs will meet in June to develop recommendations to share with the Commission and CPD.
