Here are our crime numbers, YTD, compared to the same time frame in 2024:

- Homicides - Down 27%
- Shootings - Down 39%
- Criminal Sexual Assault - Down 11%
- Robbery - Down 21%
- Burglary - Up 17%
- Felony Theft - Down 1%
- Motor Vehicle Theft - Down 15%

YTD, (334) guns have been recovered.

CPD Tip Form

Submit a tip anonymously regarding a crime or suspicious activity. In this submission you can include photos or videos related to the tip, involved suspects,

involved vehicles, and a general description of the crime or suspicious activity. You can check back on the status of that tip after submission to see how it is being addressed by CPD.

When tips are anonymously submitted by users from the web application, the information is directly sent to the Chicago Police Department's Crime Prevention and Information Center (CPIC). The tips are analyzed by CPIC and forwarded to the appropriate police unit for direct action on the tip.
