### VI. Public Discussion on Trends and Concerns in the District

The Council will facilitate a discussion with the room on the most prevalent trends and concerns in the district, share their own observations from community engagement, and record a summary for the minutes.

## District 009 – March

### 1. Federal Immigration Enforcement (Primary Concern)

Community members continue to express strong concern regarding alleged collaboration between CPD and federal immigration agencies (ICE) and the broader increase of federal immigration presence within the city. This remains the top trending issue across district councils.

### 2. Public Transit & Pedestrian Safety

Transit-related safety issues—particularly CTA incidents and pedestrian safety—were elevated during the quarterly councilors’ meeting as recurring neighborhood-level concerns.

### 3. Robberies & Burglaries

Both crimes remain among the most frequently reported community concerns across districts, continuing a pattern noted in previous months.

### 4. Mental Health-Related 911 Calls

Councilors and officers highlighted the high volume of mental-health-related service calls.

**There is growing concern about limited non-police response options and the need for expanded CARE program funding to better support residents and reduce CPD strain.**

### **5. Youth Safety & Violence Prevention**

**Youth-related safety concerns surfaced again this month, reinforced by the inclusion of Strengthening Chicago's Youth in the meeting agenda and ongoing district-level dialogue around prevention resources.**

### **6. Language Access for Strategic Plans**

**Residents expressed concern regarding the lack of current-year translations (Spanish and Chinese) for the District Strategic Plan. District 009 was one of the few districts with Chinese translation last year, and community members are requesting updated multilingual access. Follow-up is needed with CPD on translation timelines.**

### **VII. Reports from the Councilors**

Each Councilor will provide an update. Councilors will discuss their updates with themselves and meeting attendees. The Council may or may not have time limits for these updates depending on what they previously agreed upon.
